### APPLYING FOR PROTECTION

CASE provides assistance to clients who are seeking to claim protection in Australia. This assistance is free and is currently provided only to onshore clients living in Western Australia.

### FAMILY REUNION

CASE can provide assistance to people of refugee background now living in Western Australia who wish to make an application to bring their family to Australia.

### GENERALIST SERVICES

CASE provides a generalist legal service to clients from a Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CaLD) background. Initial advice is provided in one-off interviews and further appointments are made for complex matters.

Appointments are available for a wide range of legal issues including: child protection, Wills and Enduring Powers of Attorney, equal opportunity and discrimination, debts, minor criminal and traffic offences, motor vehicle accidents, criminal injuries compensation, citizenship, and others.

### CONFIDENTIALITY

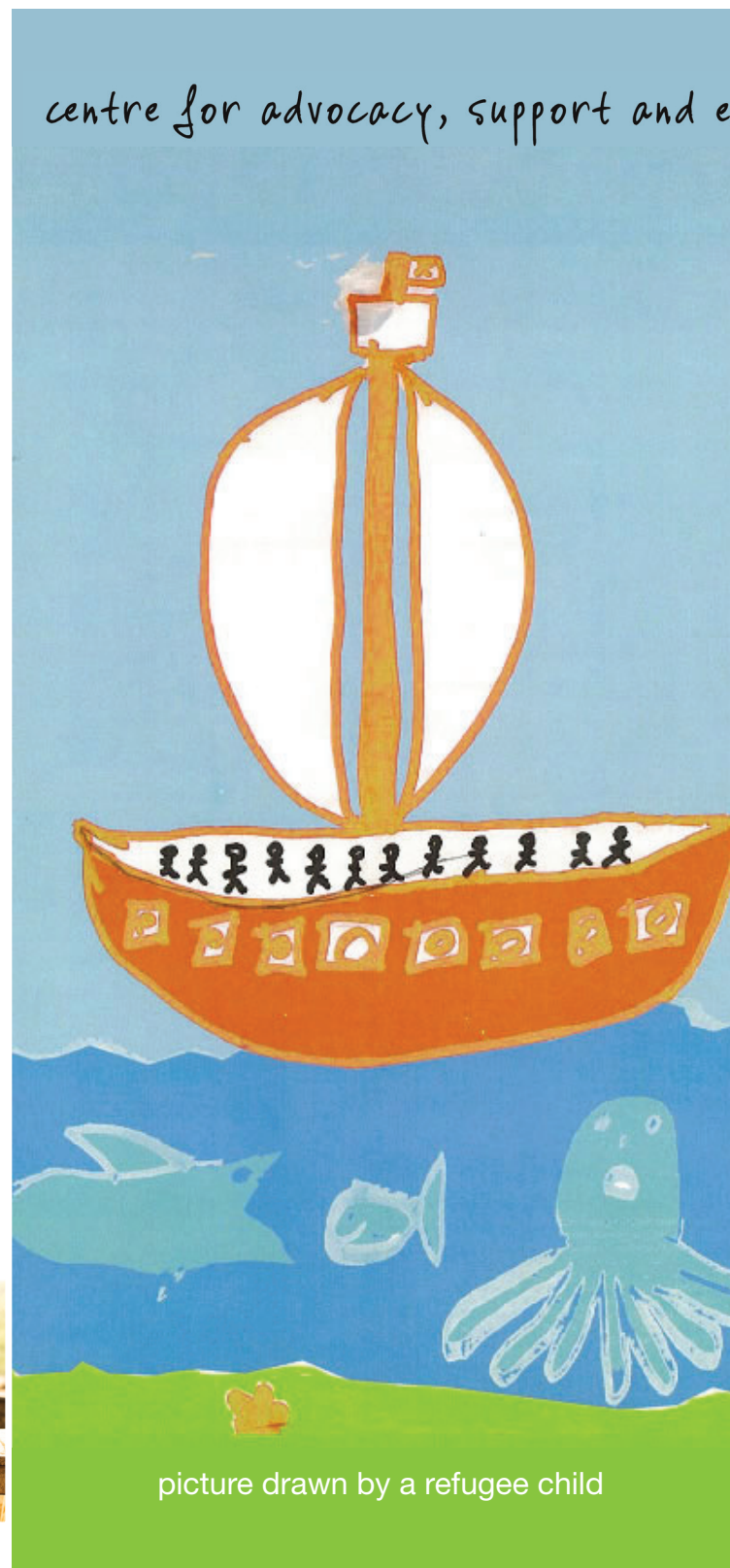
All services provided are totally confidential. There are strict privacy laws that protect people's privacy. Interpreters are also bound by these laws.
